The Designated Officer-cum-Addl.Chief Medical Officer, Ramgarh has issued a letter no.- 101, dated 09.04.2014 for initiation of Food Safety and Standers Act. 2006 against the accused Sanjeet Kumar Agarwal (Owner&Vendor) S/o Sri Shatrughan Prasad Agarwal, At-Lohra Toli, Ramgarh.

In his application dated 09.04.2014 Designated Officer-cum-Addl.Chief Medical Officer, Ramgarh has stated that the sample of Vermicelli (Sweai) bearing SI. & Code RMG-48 (2013) dated 03.02.2014 which had been Collected from the shop of Sanjeet Kumar Agarwal has been declared Sub Standard by the Food Analyst vide his report No. 141/FSSA/2014 dated 12.02.2014

The above named accused person has thus contravened the rules and specified norms and lied down under the Food Safety and Standard Regulation 2011. He has rendered himself liable to be prosecuted u/s 26, 27, and Sec- 52 of the Food Safety and Standards Act 2006. Which is in contravention of the rules and specified norms, laid down under the food safety Standard Regulation 2011 and liable to be prosecuted u/s 26, 27, and Sec- 52 of the Food Safety and Standard Act 2006 and has prayed to punish the accused u/s 26, 27, and Sec- 52 of the Act.




Heard both parties. As per report no.- 141/FSSA/2014 dated 12.02.2014 of the Food analyst State Food and Drug Laboratory, Namkum, Ranchi after due analysis of the sample of Vermicelli (Sweai) in question is misbranded within the scope of read with u/s 26, 27, and Sec- 52 of the Food safety and standards Act 2006.

I found no evidence or material to disbelieve the report of the analyst, State Food and Drug Laboratory, Namkum, Ranchi. Accordingly the accused is found guilty u/s 26, 27, and Sec- 52 of the Food Safety and Standards Act 2006 therefore he is liable for penalty of Rs. 5,000/- (Five thousand) jointly in both sections. The accused petitioner is directed to deposit the amount of penalty within 90 days of the order, failing which necessary steps under section 96 of the Act shall be initiated against the accused petitioner.
